Natural Gas

- Deliveries for August 2022
 - Gas volume of 44,104 Dekatherms (highest August consumption on record)
 - Gas consumption for August 2022 was up 9.5% from August 2021, and up over 15.9% from the August five-year average.
- Services for August 2022
 - 12 new applications for service
 - 10,625 active customers
 - 16,876 feet of new gas main lines installed; 2022 year-to-date
 - 19,315 feet of new service lines installed; 2022 year-to-date
- Gas Prices/Rates
 - The price of natural gas for September 2022 settled at \$9.353 per Dekatherm, which represents a \$0.67 increase from August's price
 - We have hedged within our pre-pay and purchased additional capacity for the winter months. Further moves may be necessary depending on weather predictions and the market.
 - The price of natural gas going forward continues to be unstable and unpredictable
 - Industry experts foresee gas prices remaining very high until at least Spring 2023

The following is the gas department update for the month of August 2022.

- **Federal Grant Application**
FING application for a \$3,809,891.00 Federal Grant is currently under review by PHMSA, we expect to hear something next 30-45 days.
- **Delivery of natural gas**
 - Gas volume moved through our system: 44,104 Dths., new consumption high for August.
 - Gas consumption for August was up 9.5%% from last August, and up over 15.9% from the August 5-year average.
- **Service Applications**
 - 12 applications for new service lines.
- **New main/service line installations**
 - We have 10,625 active customers.
 - New gas main lines installed; 2022 YTD: 16,876 feet.
 - New service lines installed; 2022 YTD: 444 services/19,315 feet.
- **Gas Supply**
 - The price of natural gas for the month of September settled at \$9.353 per Dekatherm. This represents an increase from August's price of \$0.67 per Dekatherm.
 - The price of natural gas going forward continues to be unstable and unpredictable, experts are calling for gas prices to remain very high until at least Spring of 2023.
 - We have hedged gas within our pre-pay and purchased additional capacity for the winter months. Further moves are possible depending on market and weather predictions.
- **Gas Operations**
 - We continue to see growth and development within our territory, no evidence yet of new construction slowing down, despite the fact we only received 12 new applications.

- We took position of our new Caterpillar; this will be of great help to us for new installations as well as maintenance work. Thanks for the continued support!

Projects update

- **Utilities Complex.** Continue to wait on the Land Disturbance permit. Had mtg with DHEC on Thursday, 1 September 22 regarding the permit. Hope to have permit next week.
- **Interstate Signage.** Received the estimated price for the project. Submitted permits to SCDOT for approval. Next step will be soliciting bids for the project.
- **Main St. Street scape.** Waiting on COTRANSO to provide street scape design.
- **Stage Cover.** Cost estimate for the stage is \$224,763, finalizing RFP and will get out to bid.
- **Woodside Connector.** Submitted the intent to apply for additional grant funds to complete the project.
- **Woodside Street Scape.** Currently over budget, working with SCDOT and the Mill Hill developers to mitigate costs of the project.
- **Sanctified Hill Park.** Park construction has commenced. Ground breaking ceremony will be held on Wednesday, 7 September 22.
- **Parking Lot Redesign.** Have estimates for the parking lots. Splash Pad parking lot will cost approximately \$145,242.50 to reconfigure and pave. Intend on applying for a grant for the paving and other upgrades to the area. VooDoo parking lot will cost approximately \$210,627.00 to reconfigure and pave. Exploring creating other parking lots on city properties.

d. Council Committees

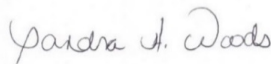
Councilmember Thomason stated that he would like to implement Council Committees. There was much discussion concerning Council Committees, but a decision was not made to implement it at that time.

Any codified procedure of the City Council governed by this Code may be suspended, altered, or amended, by unanimous consent of the Council members then present, unless doing so would otherwise violate State law. Any procedure so suspended, altered, or amended automatically reverts to the codified procedure at the earlier of: (a) the matter under consideration related to which the suspension, alteration, or amendment was obtained, is acted on by the City Council, (b) the objection of a Council member who was absent from the City Council meeting when the unanimous consent request was made, immediately following that Council member's return to the meeting, and (c) the adjournment of the City Council meeting at which the specific procedure was suspended, altered, or amended.

Motion by Mayor McLeer, second by Councilmember Blackstone to approve on First Reading, Ordinance 2022-8 - Amending Section 2-74 of the Code of Ordinances; Administrative Procedures.

The existence of cause is a matter that may be discussed by the City Council in executive sessions as permitted by the South Carolina Freedom of Information Act. The determination of removal shall be by vote in public session without a public statement of cause. A removal results in the vacancy in the position of the member so removed. Any fact, which, in the discretion of the City Council, is deemed adversely to affect the public interest, including failure to attend at least 75% of the regularly scheduled meetings of the applicable board or commission, may constitute cause.

Motion by Mayor McLeer, second by Councilmember Sanders to approve on First Reading, Ordinance 2022-9 - Adding Section 2-76 of the Code of Ordinances; Board Attendance.

The motion carried unanimously 7/0.

c. First Reading, Ordinance 2022-10 - Amending Section 12:4 of Appendix A (Zoning) of the Code of Ordinances; Zoning Approving Procedures

Mr. Bell stated that Ordinance 2022-10 amends Section 12:4 of Appendix A (Zoning) of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Fountain Inn, SC, 1992, as amended ("Code"), as previously amended by Ordinance 2022-6

The City Council shall not consider any matter that has been considered by the Planning Commission unless and until at least the seventh day after the Planning Commission's having taken final action on the matter being presented to the City Council. Before taking such lawful action as the City Council may deem advisable, the City Council shall consider the recommendation of the Planning Commission on each proposed zoning amendment. If no vote is taken by the Planning Commission within 30 days from the date of the public hearing, then the Planning Commission shall be deemed to have approved the proposed amendment. The City Council may reject any recommendation of the Planning Commission by a favorable vote of two-thirds of the Council members present and voting. If the vote of the Planning Commission on any proposed amendment results in a tie, then the Planning Commission is deemed to have provided no recommendation to the City Council.

Motion by Mayor McLeer, second by Councilmember Don to approve on First Reading, Ordinance 2022-10 - Amending Section 12:4 of Appendix A (Zoning) of the Code of Ordinances; Zoning Approving Procedures.

No protest petition shall be valid unless it is (1) written, (2) bears the actual signatures of the requisite number of property owners and states that they protest the proposed amendment, and (3) is received by the

Building Inspector in time to allow at least two normal work days (excluding weekends and legal holidays) prior to the public hearing on the amendment so as to allow time for municipal personnel to check the accuracy and sufficiency of the petition.

Motion by Mayor McLeer, second by Councilmember Garrett to approve on First Reading, Ordinance 2022-11, Amending Section 12:5 of Appendix A (Zoning) of the Code of Ordinances; Zoning Petition Procedure.

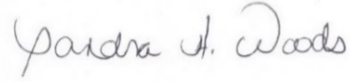

ORDINANCE 2022-8**

**AMENDING SECTION 2-74 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE
CITY OF FOUNTAIN INN, SOUTH CAROLINA, 1992, AS AMENDED
("CODE").**

WHEREAS, the City Council ("Council") of the City of Fountain Inn ("City") finds:

(a) The Council is authorized and empowered to provide for its internal operation according to South Carolina Constitution Article VIII, section 17, and the Home Rule Act of 1975;

Sec. 2-74. – Robert's rules of order to govern in absence of specific rule; Council may deviate from codified procedures.

In all matters not otherwise ~~especially~~ covered by the rules set out in this division, the latest edition of Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised, when applicable, shall govern the City Council. Any codified procedure of the City Council governed by this Code may be suspended, altered, or amended, by unanimous consent of the Council members then present, unless doing so would otherwise violate State law. Any procedure so suspended, altered, or amended automatically reverts to the codified procedure at the earlier of: (a) the matter under consideration related to which the suspension, alteration, or amendment was obtained, is acted on by the City Council, (b) the objection of a Council member who was absent from the City Council meeting when the unanimous consent request was made, immediately following that Council member's return to the meeting, and (c) the adjournment of the City Council meeting at which the specific procedure was suspended, altered, or amended.

2. Codification. The amendment to section 2-74 shall be codified as part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Fountain Inn, South Carolina, 1992, as amended, or as otherwise provided as part of the City's next re-codification.

3. Severability. If any part of this Ordinances is unenforceable for any reason, then the remainder of this Ordinance remains in full force and effect.

**ADDING SECTION 2-76 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE
CITY OF FOUNTAIN INN, SOUTH CAROLINA, 1992, AS AMENDED
("CODE").**

WHEREAS, the City Council ("Council") of the City of Fountain Inn ("City") finds:

(a) The Council is authorized and empowered to provide for its internal operation according to South Carolina Constitution Article VIII, section 17, and the Home Rule Act of 1975;

(b) The Council has determined it is necessary and appropriate to provide for the removal of members of boards and commissions for cause; and

(c) The Council desires to set forth the authority in a new section of the Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council ordains:

1. Amendment. The Code is amended by adding Section 2-76, as follows:

Sec. 2-76. – Removal of Members of Boards and Commissions.

The City Council, by a vote of two-thirds of the Council members present and voting, may remove, for cause, any member of any board or commission, the members of which are appointed by the City Council. The existence of cause is a matter that may be discussed by the City Council in executive sessions as permitted by the South Carolina Freedom of Information Act. The determination of removal shall be by vote in public session without a public statement of cause. A removal results in the vacancy in the position of the member so removed. Any fact, which, in the discretion of the City Council, is deemed adversely to affect the public interest, including failure to attend at least 75% of the regularly scheduled meetings of the applicable board or commission, may constitute cause.

2. Reservation. Sections 2-77 through and including 2-100 of the Code are reserved for future use.

3. Codification. The amendment to section 2-76 shall be codified as part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Fountain Inn, South Carolina, 1992, as amended, or as otherwise provided as part of the City's next re-codification.

4. Severability. If any part of this Ordinance is unenforceable for any reason, then the remainder of this Ordinance remains in full force and effect.

5. Effective Date. Any ordinance introduced prior to this Ordinance's enactment must proceed through two readings as if this Ordinance had not been enacted. Any ordinance introduced after this Ordinance's introduction must proceed according to this Ordinance.

**AMENDING SECTION 12:4 OF APPENDIX A (ZONING) OF THE CODE

AMENDED BY ORDINANCE 2022-6.**

WHEREAS, the City Council (“Council”) of the City of Fountain Inn (“City”) finds:

(a) The Council is authorized and empowered to provide for its internal operation according to South Carolina Constitution Article VIII, section 17, and the Home Rule Act of 1975;

(b) The Council previously amended section 12:4 of Appendix A of the City Code by Ordinance 2022-6, to clarify, among other things, the mechanism through which the Council processes matters after consideration by the Planning Commission; and

(c) The Council desires further to clarify certain aspects of Council’s procedure related to Planning Commission matters.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council ordains:

1. Amendment. Section 12:4 of Appendix A of the Code is amended with such items underlined being added to and such items stricken through being removed from, as follows:

The City Council shall not consider any matter that has been considered by the Planning Commission unless and until at least the seventh day after the Planning Commission’s having taken final action on the matter being presented to the City Council. Before taking such lawful action as ~~the City Council~~ may deem advisable, the City Council shall consider the recommendation of the Planning Commission on each proposed zoning amendment. If no ~~recommendation~~ vote is ~~received from~~ taken by the Planning Commission within 30 days from the date of the public hearing, then the Planning Commission shall be deemed to have approved the proposed amendment. The City Council may reject any recommendation of the Planning Commission by a favorable vote of two-thirds of the Council members present and voting. If the vote of the Planning Commission on any proposed amendment results in a tie, then the Planning Commission is deemed to have provided no recommendation to the City Council.

2. Codification. The amendment to section 12:4 of Appendix A of the Code shall be codified as part of the Appendix A (Zoning) of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Fountain Inn, South Carolina, 1992, as amended, or as otherwise provided as part of the City’s next re-codification.

3. Severability. If any part of this Ordinances is unenforceable for any reason, then the remainder of this Ordinance remains in full force and effect.

4. Effective Date. Any ordinance introduced prior to this Ordinance’s enactment must proceed through two readings as if this Ordinance had not been enacted. Any ordinance introduced after this Ordinance’s introduction must proceed according to this Ordinance.

- (b) Section 12:5 of Appendix A of the City Code provides, among other things, a mechanism through which the Council addresses a petition against a proposed zoning change; and
- (c) The Council desires to clarify certain aspects of Council’s procedure for addressing such a petition.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council ordains:

1. Amendment. Section 12:5 of Appendix A of the Code is amended with such items underlined being added to and such items stricken through being removed from, as follows:

In case of a protest against any proposed zoning change signed by the owners of 20 percent or more of the lots included in the proposed change; or of those immediately adjacent to, in the rear, or on either side extending 100 feet; or of those directly opposite extending 100 feet from the street frontage of such opposite lots any amendment shall not become effective except by favorable vote of five members of the City Council including the Mayor ~~two-thirds of the Council~~ members present and voting.

No protest petition shall be valid unless it is (1) written, (2) bears the actual signatures of the requisite number of property owners and states that they protest the proposed amendment, and (3) is received by the Building Inspector in time to allow at least two normal work days (excluding weekends and legal holidays) prior to the public hearing on the amendment so as to allow time for municipal personnel to check the accuracy and sufficiency of the petition.

2. Codification. The amendment to section 12:5 of Appendix A of the Code shall be codified as part of the Appendix A (Zoning) of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Fountain Inn, South Carolina, 1992, as amended, or as otherwise provided as part of the City’s next re-codification.

3. Severability. If any part of this Ordinances is unenforceable for any reason, then the remainder of this Ordinance remains in full force and effect.

4. Effective Date. Any ordinance introduced prior to this Ordinance’s enactment must proceed through two readings as if this Ordinance had not been enacted. Any ordinance introduced after this Ordinance’s introduction must proceed according to this Ordinance.

ORDINANCE 2022-12**

**AMENDING CHAPTER 19 (TRAFFIC AND MOTOR VEHICLES) OF
THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF FOUNTAIN INN,
SOUTH CAROLINA, 1992, AS AMENDED (“CODE”) TO ADD SECTION
19-6 (SPEED HUMPS).**

WHEREAS, South Carolina law authorizes municipalities to take actions not inconsistent with the Constitution and general laws of the State, regarding any subject the municipality finds necessary and proper for the general welfare, safety, and convenience of the municipality;

WHEREAS, South Carolina Code Annotated section 56-5-710 authorizes a local government to provide traffic control signals, including speed humps, to control traffic flow in the City limits;

WHEREAS, the Code does not address the use of speed humps as a traffic control signal; and

WHEREAS, as a matter of addressing traffic safety in the City limits, the City Council desires to enact this Ordinance as a means of providing for the use of speed humps as a traffic control signal;

NOW THEREFORE, CITY COUNCIL ORDAINS:

1. Amendment. The Code is amended by adding Section 19-6, as follows:

Sec. 19-6. – Regulation for the Installation of Speed Humps.

(a) Purpose; Definitions

- (1) The purpose of this Section is to provide for the evaluation and selection of roadways for the installation of Speed Humps. Where appropriate, other traffic-calming measures should be considered and/or implemented prior to the installation of a Speed Hump. Prior to the approval and installation of a Speed Hump, the Director of Public Works must designate the type and location.

- (2) For purposes of this section,

(a) a “Speed Hump” is a raised area intended to control vehicular speed in conformity with the details outlined in this section; and

(b) “Director” means the Director of the Public Works Department.

- (b) Requests for Installation. A request for the installation of a Speed Hump must be in writing and submitted to the Director of Public Works. The person requesting a Speed Hump shall provide the specific nature of the concern causing the request. Each Speed Hump request must be evaluated in the order in which it is received. A road shall not be placed on the list for the installation of a Speed Hump absent the City’s holding private funding.

- (c) Eligibility Requirements. A request is only eligible for consideration if the following criteria are met:

- (1) with respect to a City roadway:

(a) The roadway must be a City-maintained, local, residential, paved, public street with a minimum 20-foot travel way;

- (b) The roadway must have a classification of one of the following: “residential collector,” “residential subcollector,” or “residential access street,” as described in Article 8 of Appendix B (Road Classification and Design Standards) of the Code;
 - (c) The roadway must be in reasonably good condition as determined by the Director;
 - (d) The roadway must be a two-lane residential road with a posted speed limit of 25 mph or less;
 - (e) The roadway must have average speeds exceeding the posted speed limit by at least 10 mph, as determined by a speed limit study conducted by the Fountain Inn Police Department;
 - (f) The roadway must not be a primary access for a commercial or an industrial site;
 - (g) Each resident living adjacent to the roadway and no more than 300 feet, and 85% of the residents living adjacent to the roadway and no more than 1320 feet, from the proposed location(s) must sign the petition requesting the Speed Hump(s) and appointing a spokesperson for the petition. The petition must identify the specific proposed location(s) of each Speed Hump; or
- (2) with respect to a South Carolina Department of Transportation (“SCDOT”) roadway, written permission from the SCDOT, which has been obtained by the person or entity requesting the installation of a Speed Hump.
- (d) Evaluation Process. The Director shall evaluate each request that meets the initial eligibility based on the following criteria:
- (1) After the Director confirms the impacted area as described above, the applicant must provide written notice to all residents within that area advising of the request for a Speed Hump and the right of any resident in the impacted area to object to the request for a Speed Hump by providing written notice of that objection to the Director no more than 10 days of receipt of that notice. This notice must be provided by the applicant by certified mail, return receipt requested with restricted delivery. An applicant must provide proof of transmittal of each notice by providing the Director with a receipt for each resident or a failure to accept the notice in the impacted area.
 - (2) The Director must receive positive feedback from the Fountain Inn Police Department and the Fountain Inn Fire Department.
 - (3) If the Director determines a Speed Hump is acceptable in the proposed location(s), then the Director shall provide that favorable recommendation to the City Administrator for review. If the City Administrator determines a Speed Hump is acceptable in the proposed location(s), then the City Administrator shall provide that favorable recommendation to the City Council for consideration.
- (e) Design and Construction.
- (1) A Speed Hump’s design and construction must conform to the specifications as outlined in the Flat-Topped Speed Hump Details, which are attached and incorporated by reference, with such deviations as may be approved by the Director, in the Director’s reasonable discretion.

(2) All signage and pavement markings must conform to the then-current Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways (MUTCD).

(3) A Speed Hump shall not be placed in a location that is anticipated to interfere with any stormwater, drainage, or utilities.

(4) Temporary Speed Hump.

(a) The Director may recommend the use of a temporary Speed Hump in place of a permanent Speed Hump.

(b) Other than being temporary, the design and construction of a temporary Speed Hump must be equivalent to that of a permanent Speed Hump.

(f) Removal. The City is entitled to remove any Speed Hump at any time and for any reason, including road work. Once removed, a permanent Speed Hump is not reusable. If an applicant desires to have a permanent Speed Hump reinstalled, then that applicant must reapply and shall bear the cost to replace, if approved through the process provided in this section, the removed Speed Hump. If an applicant desires to have a temporary Speed Hump reinstalled, then the applicant must bear the cost of removal, storage, and reinstallation, if approved through the process provided in this section, of the temporary Speed Hump.

(g) Payment. The applicant is responsible for all costs, including design, construction, installation, maintenance, removal (and, if a temporary Speed Hump, storage), of each Speed Hump and related signage, and reinstallation (if reinstallation is approved by the City) of a Speed Hump.

2. Reservation. Sections 19-7 through and including 19-20 of the Code are reserved for future use.

3. Codification. Section 19-6 shall be codified as part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Fountain Inn, South Carolina, 1992, as amended, or as otherwise provided as part of the City's next re-codification.

4. Severability. If any part of this Ordinance is unenforceable for any reason, then the remainder of this Ordinance remains in full force and effect. The Council declares that it would have enacted this Ordinance and each part thereof irrespective of the unenforceability of any portion.

5. General Repealer. Each Code section, ordinance, resolution, order, or other directive of the City, or part of the same, in conflict with this Ordinance, is, to the extent of that conflict, repealed.

6. Effective Date. Any ordinance introduced prior to this Ordinance's enactment must proceed through two readings as if this Ordinance had not been enacted. Any ordinance introduced after this Ordinance's introduction must proceed according to this Ordinance.

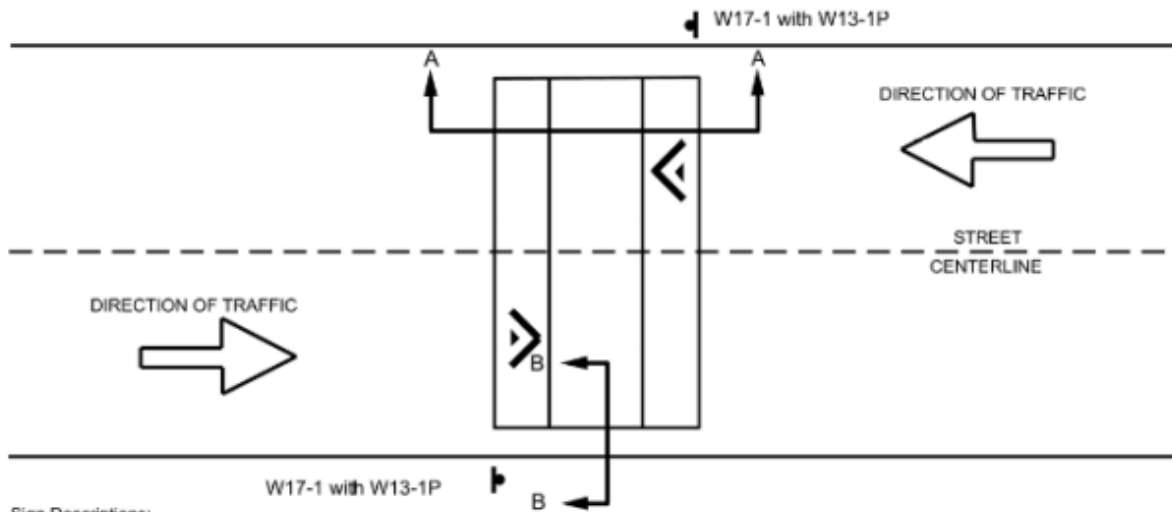

(CONSTRUCTION DETAIL)

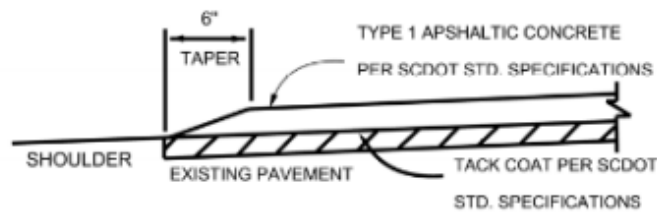
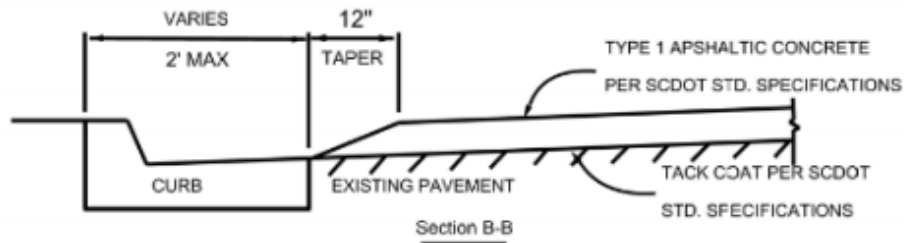
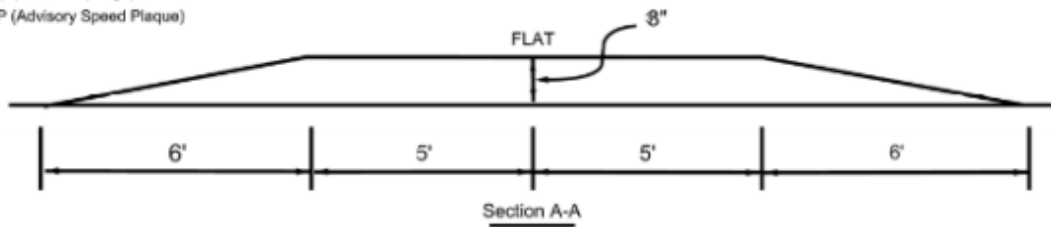

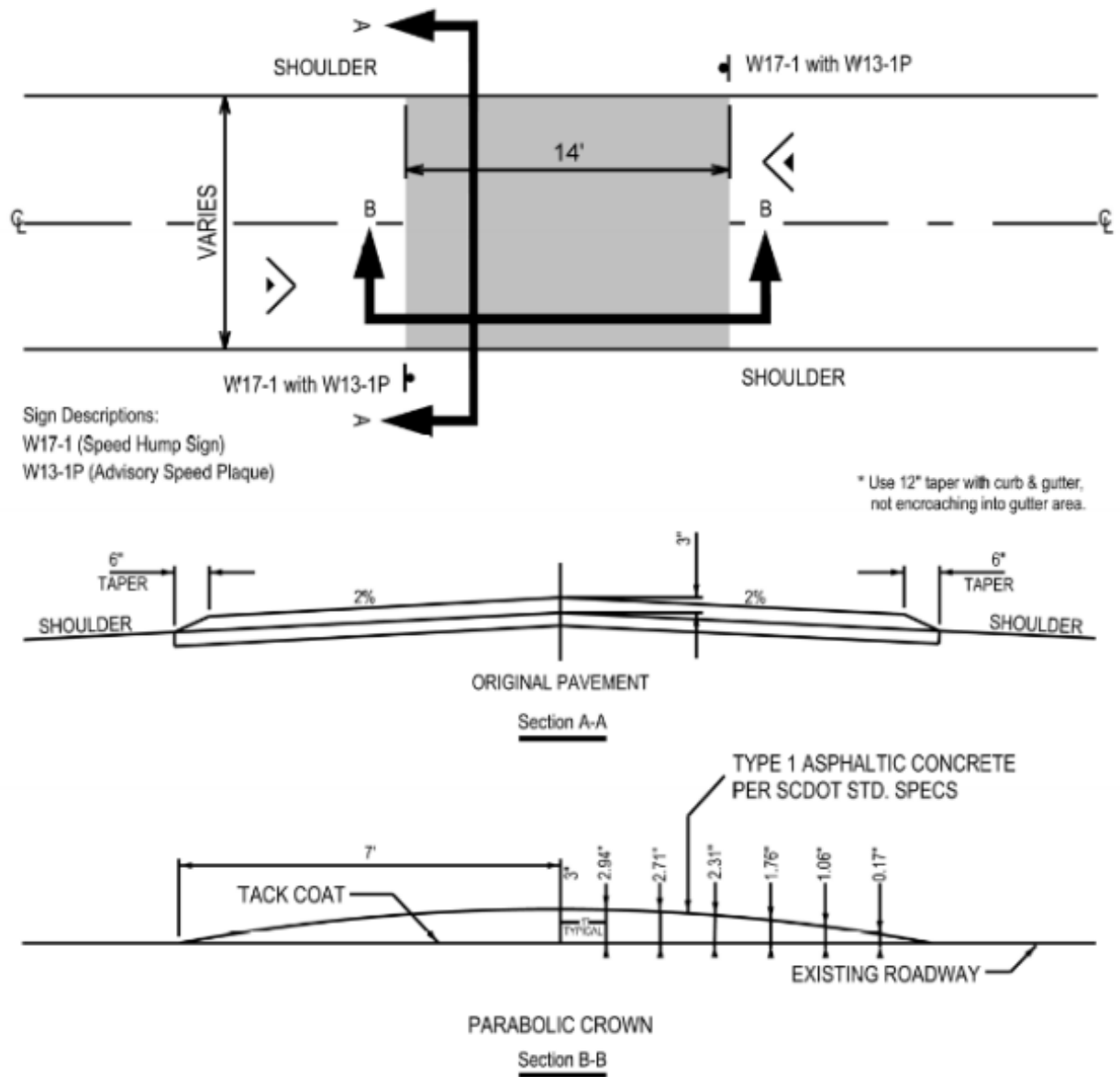


Shoulder Detail for Street Without Curb

Agenda Item

Authorize the City Administrator to execute an emergency agreement with SafeBuilt for Building Official Services.

Background Information

It is necessary for the City to retain the services of an outside contractor to perform Building Official related services to ensure compliance with the City's Code of Ordinances. The City has utilized a third-party Building Official through a contract with RCI Inc., since 2013. Staff notified RCI Inc., via certified mail and email that the contract will end on September 30, 2022. To reduce the impact on services staff recommends SafeBuilt's services to begin on Monday September 12, 2022, for a term of one year.

Staff has consulted with King Kozlarek and contract negotiations are being finalized.

Contract Highlights:

- Terms: 12 month term with an option to automatically renew for a subsequent 12 month term
- Termination: Either party may terminate with a 90 days written notice of termination with or without cause and with no penalty or additional cost beyond the rates stated in the agreement.
- Includes a fiscal non-appropriation clause.
- Rates, by contract are scheduled to increase on January 1, 2024, and annually thereafter by CPI-U (Consumer Price Index United States City Average, but not to exceed 4%

Staff Recommendation

Staff recommends Council to authorize the City Administrator to execute an agreement with SafeBuilt for Building Official Services.

Fiscal Impact

This item is budgeted in the current fiscal year, with an expense in the general fund. However, due to the increase in rates from those included in the contract with RCI, Inc., which were also used in the formulation of the FY 22-23 budget, this item is projected to exceed budget by approximately \$42,651.
